Anne Boleyn is England's most famous ghost. Anne was young and beautiful when she became the second wife of Henry VIII in 1533. They had a daughter in the same year, but, after only three years of marriage, Henry ordered Anne's execution. Why? Well, she was accused of many things, but the real reason was that Henry thought she couldn't give him a son. What's more, he was already in love with another woman who would become his next wife... So Anne was beheaded, almost certainly for crimes she didn't commit. Ever since then, her ghost has been seen in several places, including the Tower of London where she was executed and Blickling Hall in Norfolk where it is thought she was born. There, every year, on 19th May – the anniversary of her death – they say her ghost appears in a coach and horses, driven by a headless coachman, with her own head in her hands! The coach drives up to the house then, as soon as it arrives in front of the main entrance, it vanishes.
