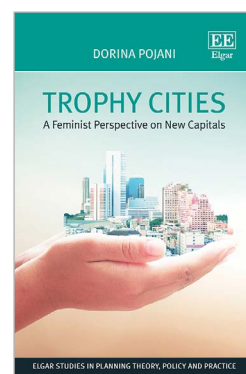
A feminist perspective on new capitals
