She paused, then added, "There's also a bit of a challenge with the length of his legs."

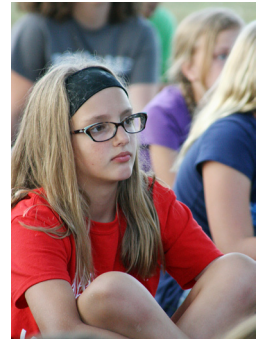

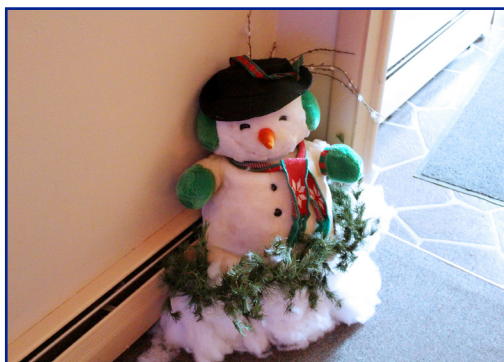

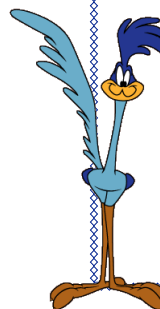
