



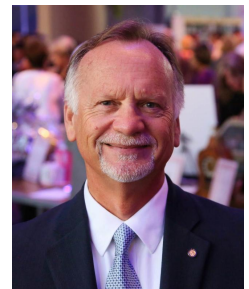

Hot Topics

Restoration of Engine 17 and Rescue 22

Great news from the LBFD for Fourth District residents! We learned this week that Engine 17, located on the east side of Stearns Park, will be back in service on October 16th. We'll have an event at Station 17 on October 21st at 11:00 am to commemorate the restoration of E17 after being out of service for seven years. And there's more great news: Rescue 17 will remain serving the 4th district as it is reassigned to Station 22 at Atherton and Palo Verde with a designation of Paramedic Rescue 22. Long Beach Relocation Ordinance versus AB 1482

Our office has received an number of inquiries, from both tenants and landlords, concerning the City Relocation Ordinance and Assembly Bill 1482, the State Tenant Protections Act. The local ordinance was effective on August 1, 2019, and the State legislation is expected to go into effect on January 1, 2020. Questions immediately arose as to the differences, so we asked the City Manager and City Attorney to analyze the State legislation and provide us some guidelines we can share with constituents. Details of that

analysis will appear in upcoming newsletters. While there appears to be no instances where both laws cannot apply, it would be a very complex application.

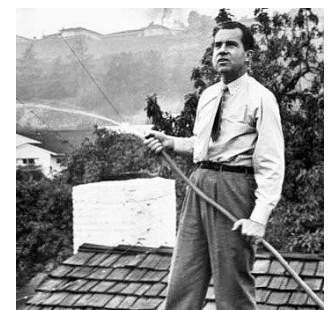

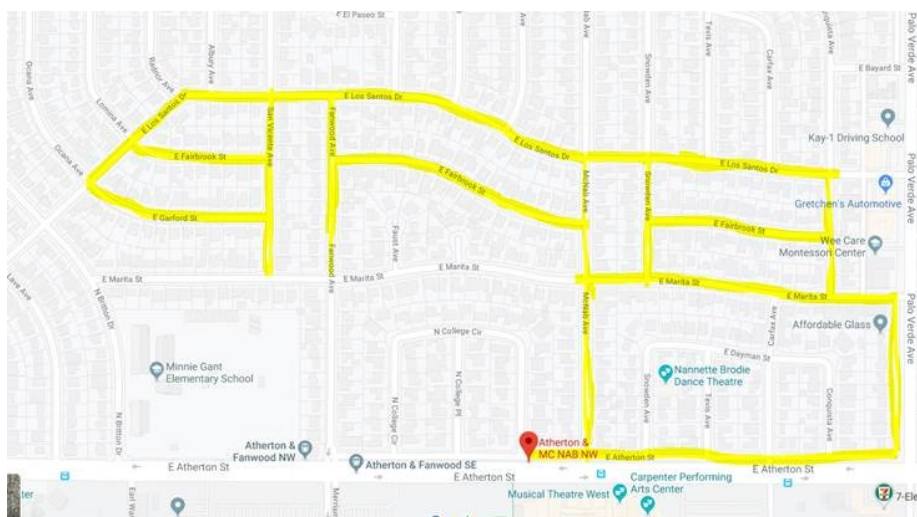

October 21st | 7 am - 3:30 pm | Los Altos Area

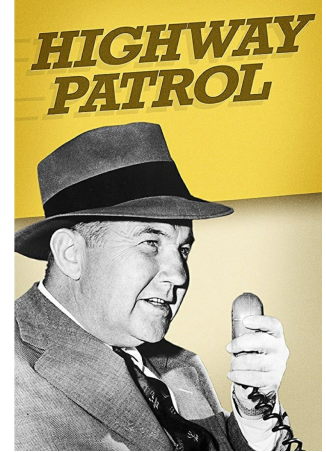
As you may be aware, Long Beach Energy Resources (LBER) has an ongoing maintenance and replacement program to replace portions of buried natural gas piping systems throughout the city of Long Beach. This program is designed to ensure that gas distribution facilities will continue to function at the high standards of safety, reliability, and efficiency expected by LBER. There will be a main and gas service pipeline replacement project projected to start Monday, October 21st on and near E. Los Santos Dr. between Ocana Ave and Conquista Ave.
