White County Agricultural Association, Inc.

The White County Agricultural Association, Inc. is the legal organization that sets the policy for the White County 4-H Program. The Ag. Association is also the owner of the 4-H Fairgrounds in Reynolds.

Each township in White County provides two directors to serve on the Ag. Association. Each director may serve a maximum of eight years. One 4-H Jr. Leader representative also serves on the board. The directors meet throughout the year to reach the following objectives:

1. To encourage the adoption of better agricultural and home economic practices in White County through 4-H.
2. To promote and aid the Cooperative Extension Service by sponsoring and providing funds and policy needed for the 4-H Program and the 4-H Club exhibit in White County.
3. To provide, supervise and control the 4-H Club buildings and grounds of White County.

Directors serve on 4-H Project Committees and are the liaisons between these committees and the Ag. Association. In this role, the directors bring requests to the Ag. Association board for assistance with items such as guidelines and finances. Additionally, the members of the Ag. Association annually plan the 4-H Fair program and schedule, and coordinate all concession stands and commercial exhibits.

4-H families are encouraged to contact their township Ag. Association directors to ask questions or to give comments and suggestions regarding the White County 4-H Program.

SWINE AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 market swine animal may be sold per member.
2. Members who wish to consign a market swine as their one sale entry, must do so by declaring the swine sale animal at weigh in or on Fair Entry.
3. If a turn buyer is not provided, all swine will be the responsibility of the 4-H member, and must be removed from the fairgrounds by 8 pm on Thursday of the fair.

NOTE: Refer also to Swine Rules in the White Co. 4-H Handbook.

SHEEP AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 market lamb may be sold per member.
2. Members who wish to consign a lamb as their one sale entry, must do so by declaring the lamb sale animal at weigh in or in Fair Entry.

RABBIT AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 fryer or 1 meat pen or 1 roaster or 1 stewer may be sold per member.
2. Each meat pen rabbit must weigh a minimum of 3 1/2 pounds.
3. Members who wish to consign a fryer, roaster, stewer, or meat pen as their one auction entry, must do so by declaring the fryer, roaster, stewer, or meat pen auction animal by 9 p.m. on Friday of the fair or in Fair Entry

GOAT AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 goat wether or meat market doe may be sold per member.
2. Members who wish to consign a goat as their one auction entry, must do so by declaring the wether or meat market doe auction animal at check in or in Fair Entry.
3. The Grand Champion dairy and meat wethers will be eligible to serve as 2 spotlight animals from goats. If Grand Champion animal declines to sell, Reserve Grand Champion animal from that class may be substituted as a spotlight animal. In odd-numbered years, Dairy Wether spotlight animal will be first goat lot to be sold; in even-numbered years, Meat Wether spotlight animal will be first goat lot to be sold.

POULTRY AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 bird may be sold per member.
2. Members who wish to consign a bird as their one auction entry, must do so by declaring the poultry auction animal at check in or in Fair Entry.
3. Poultry entries include chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, guineas, & pigeons. One Grand Exhibition & one Grand Commercial champion exhibit will be selected to serve as the 2 highlight animals from poultry.
4. If a suitable market cannot be found, the wing of each bird going through the auction will be clipped to insure that the animal will be ineligible for competition at future 4-H Shows.

Spotlight auction lots will be offered to the 2 highest placing of the following 4 animals listed: 1)Grand Champion; 2)Reserve Grand Champion 3) Champion County Bred; 4) Reserve Champ. County Bred. Swine may offer the spotlight auction lots to 3rd Overall, 4th Overall, and/or 5th Overall if the Grand and/or 5th Overall if all 4 of the previously listed winners decline to sell.

12. White County 4-H members shall be allowed to donate any or all of the proceeds from the sale of an animal at the White County 4-H Fair Livestock Auction to a 4-H related organization, a charity, or a scholarship fund of their choice. Upon proper notification of the donation, as defined below, the White County Ag. Assoc. Livestock Auction Committee is responsible to deduct and withhold proper amount of money from livestock sale checks prior to checks being written and distributed to individual 4-H members.
13. Notification of donation will be properly made by member filling out the “Notification of Donation” statement on the Auction Declaration Form or by completing the “Notification of Donation” in FairEntry. The Auction Declaration Form, inclusive with the notification of donation must be filled out in its entirety and submitted by the prescribed deadline. See Rule #10 above. The animal identified on the auction declaration form is the only animal and the same animal that must be used to generate the donated funds and may be sold only once at the livestock auction. All rules applying to the Livestock Auction and Auction Declaration Forms apply.

Other stipulations and clarification:

- a. Any animal in the auction can be sold only one time.
- b. Impromptu requests for announcement, or decisions to donate will not be recognized or announced at the sale or written into sale programs. Only those on the above stated proper forms handed in within the proper time frame will be recognized or announced at the Auction
- c. Donations withheld by the Livestock committee shall be deposited in lump sum into the general fund or, if desired, a special account of the White County Ag. Assoc. Treasury. Distribution of the donations to the appropriate organizations, charities, or scholarship funds, shall be by check, written by Ag. Assoc. Treasurer, and will identify the 4-H member as the donor.
14. A draft of the auction bill will be posted in each barn on Sunday and will be removed by 7:00 a.m. on Monday. Corrections (not additions of un-declared animals) must be reported to the Auction Committee by 7:00 a.m. on Monday.
15. The White County Ag. Association reserves the right to examine and/or test any 4-H animal exhibit.....See **General 4-H Livestock Rules** in the 2021 White County 4-H Handbook.
16. If the Auction Committee receives notice at any time that a check has been lost/destroyed or if a check has not been cashed within 90 days of the auction date, a stop pay order will be placed on the check, and the 4-H member must pay \$32 to have the check re-issued.

BEEF AUCTION RULES

1. Each 4-H Beef member may sell only one market beef animal in the Beef Auction.
2. Members who wish to consign a beef calf as their one sale entry, must do so by declaring the beef sale animal at weigh in or in FairEntry.
3. Leading the calf through the sale ring is an option and at the 4-H'ers discretion.

DAIRY BEEF AUCTION RULES

1. Only 1 Dairy Beef Steer may be sold per member..
2. Members who wish to consign a dairy beef steer as their one sale entry, must do so by declaring the steer at weigh in or in FairEntry

4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION

GENERAL AUCTION RULES

1. 4-H members may sell only one livestock project - either beef, or sheep, or swine, or rabbits, or goat, or poultry.
2. No animal may be sold that has not been shown.
 - a. If something happens to an animal while at the fair (circumstances beyond the control of the 4-H'er) and it is unable to be shown, then a decision can be made by the White County Ag. Association Executive Committee to override rule #2.
3. No leased animals can be sold. Each animal in the auction must be owned by the selling 4-H member and properly identified/enrolled in 4h Online and Fair Entry by that member.
4. Each 4-H member is limited to sale of 1 market beef animal, or 1 dairy steer, or 1 lamb, or 1 market swine, or 1 fryer, stewart, roaster or meat pen of rabbits, or 1 goat, or 1 poultry. Member may enter arena only once during the sale except where a member exhibits more than one grand champion livestock project.
5. If member exhibits more than one grand champion livestock project in the current year, he/she will be permitted to sell any or all of these animals, but no additional animals in the 4-H Auction.
6. Members are encouraged, but not required, to declare their auction animals in Fair Entry when registering their animals. Auction declaration forms and changes to auction declarations made in Fair Entry are due by 3:00 p.m. Saturday.
7. All buyers will pay the Auction Committee, NOT the sellers, for their purchases. The committee will pay the sellers.
8. A 2% sales commission will be charged to all sellers of all pool and auction animals, to be used for the promotion and benefit of the White County 4-H Program.
9. All animals sold must be kept or turned by buyer. **NO ANIMALS MAY BE RETURNED TO 4-H MEMBER.** Animals sold in 4-H Livestock Auction are ineligible to be exhibited in future 4-H youth shows.
10. Members may declare only one sale animal of one species for the 4-H Livestock Sale. All sale animals must be declared by 3:00 p.m. Saturday of the Fair. Declaration forms may be turned in at animal check-in or weigh-in or at the Fair Office, but all forms must be submitted by 3:00 p.m. Changes to auction declarations made in Fair Entry must be made at the Fair Office and must be submitted by 3 pm. After this time, only changes related to spotlight animal sales will be allowed. See Rule #11 below.
11. If a member wins Grand or Reserve Grand Champion of a species and has not declared any animal for 4-H Livestock Auction, he or she may add this Grand or Reserve Grand Champion by contacting Auction Committee by 10:00 p.m. on the day of that animal's show. Likewise, if a member wins Grand or Reserve Grand Champion of a species and has already declared another animal for the auction, he or she may amend the previous declaration by substituting the original animal for the eligible spotlight auction animal. This must be done by contacting the Auction Committee by 10:00 p.m. on the day **of the spotlight animal's show.** If the Grand or Res. Grand declines to sell it may be substituted with the Champion County Bred and /or Reserve Champion County Bred in that order. Only a
