SERVICE OF WORD AND SACRAMENT

WORSHIP NOTE: THE PASCHAL CANDLE

Since the 5th century, the Paschal Candle has been used in the Church from Easter Sunday to Ascension Day. The Paschal Candle is lit for all worship services, during these forty days, as a symbol of the Resurrection. The rest of the year, the candle stands beside the Baptismal Font. The Paschal Candle is lit for each baptism, and placed by the casket of each burial, reminding us we are baptized and buried into Christ our Risen Lord. Paschal means “pertaining to the Passover,” or in the Christian Church, “Easter.”

Worship Tidbit for the 5th Sunday of Easter

The Liturgy of the Sacrament – The Words of Institution: When we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we are not merely remembering what our Savior did. The Words of Institution consecrate the elements of bread and wine. The Words of Institution are proclaimed to the congregation to assure us that we are eating and drinking just what Jesus says: "This is my body." "This is my blood." It is a "new covenant," which is "for you, for the forgiveness of sins." One of the early Church fathers, Augustine (354–450) explains why we proclaim the Words of Institution: "*The word is added, and it becomes a sacrament.*" Through this sacrament, our Good Shepherd continues to feed, nourish, and strengthen his flock.

WINDOWS AND SIDING UPDATE

Our congregation recently signed a contract with Kerns Brothers to replace the windows and siding on the church. The total cost of the project is \$62,500, and to date our generous offerings have raised \$26,500 for the project. While our church council has applied for a \$36,000 loan through Lutheran Association for Church Extension (LACE), it remains our goal to encourage gifts to limit the amount of debt we incur for the project. ADULT BIBLE CLASS – NEW SERIES

“ELEPHANTS IN THE ROOM” – Evolution vs. The Words of Scripture

One of the great wars being waged against the Christian faith today is done by attacking the biblical teaching of creation. Many within the Church have tried to find a compromise between creation and science (evolution) called theistic evolution. This Bible study compares scriptural teaching with theistic evolution and shows that theistic evolution ends up compromising, not just biblical creation but all the major teachings of Scripture: the nature of God’s original perfect creation, the origin and perfect nature of the first humans, the fall into sin, sin’s curse on creation, God’s plan of salvation for sinners, the saving work of Jesus Christ, and the source of “right and wrong.”

Each lesson begins with a study of Scripture and then compares that with the teachings of theistic evolutionists presented in their own words.

Bible Matters is a topical discussion group that enables God’s people to become more comfortable in discussing matters of the Christian faith and more confident in defending the Bible’s teachings. We encourage open dialogue and welcome bold questions. All are welcome to consider how God’s word addresses various topics.

Topics for our spring sessions are:

April 14	What does it mean to be “on the right side of history”?
April 21	Is the Old Testament God (vengeful) the same as the New Testament God (merciful)?
April 28	Are the Ten Commandments still valid? Do they need to be updated?
May 5	-- <i>NO Bible Matters</i> --
May 12	I’ve been confronted about my faith. How do I respond?
May 19	Is there value to “thoughts and prayers”?
May 26	How do God and religion really help you get through tough times?
