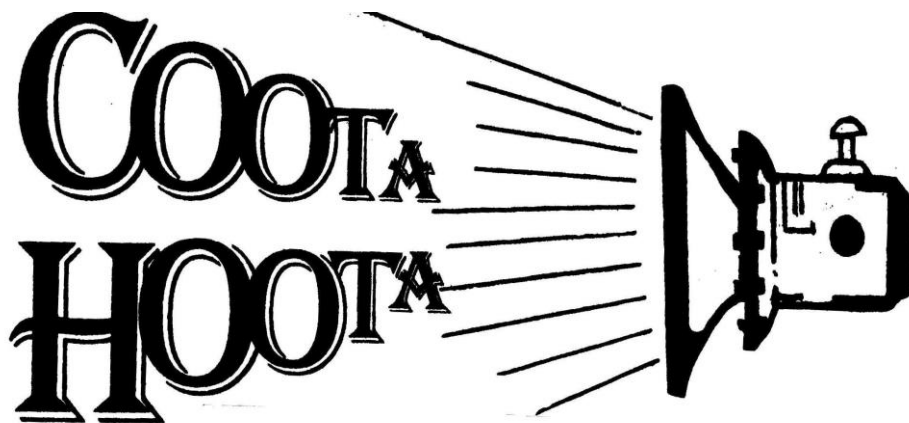

60 CLASS : GARRATTS

These were the last class of steam locomotives introduced on the NSW Government Railways. They were placed in service from 1952. There were 42 of this class. They were the ultimate development of steam freight locomotives.

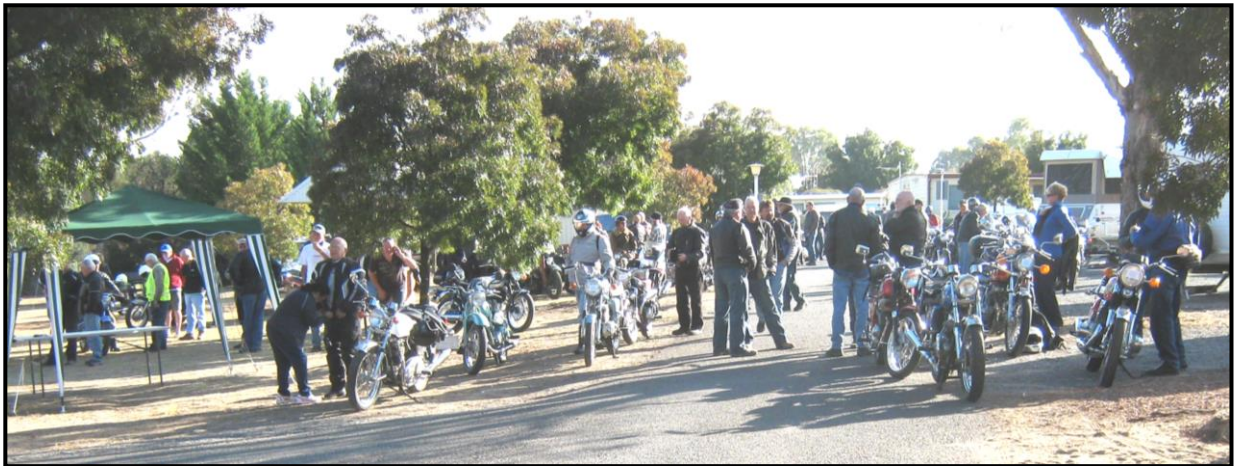
It was great to meet up with old acquaintances and to make new friends.
