

Relating to Signs and Armings.

Be It Ordained, by the City Council of the City of Fort Collins, Colorado.

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 14, of the Series of 1906, be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. No person shall in this City set up or cause to be set up, any sign or sign box that extend over or upon any sidewalk more than two feet from the inside line thereof, excepting electrical and illuminated signs costing not less than Twenty-five Dollars, which must be constructed under the supervision of the Building Inspector and shall be so constructed and set up as not to extend more than eight feet from the property line and be placed twelve feet above the sidewalk; and no person shall suspend any merchandise or other articles in front of any house or building so that the same shall at any height project more than two feet over or upon any sidewalk. No person shall expose or offer any merchandise or other property for show upon any sidewalk in this City, excepting hawkers and peddlers who may have licenses as provided in Ordinance No. 17, of the Series of 1911. Nothing in this Section shall be so construed as to prevent merchants or manufacturers from occupying with their wares two feet of the sidewalk, and nothing herein shall be so construed as to prevent merchants from occupying a greater space on the sidewalk when receiving or shipping goods for a period not more than

eight hours, with at least one-half of the sidewalk kept clear for public use at all times.
